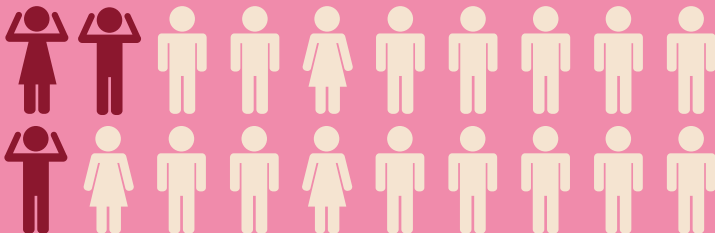

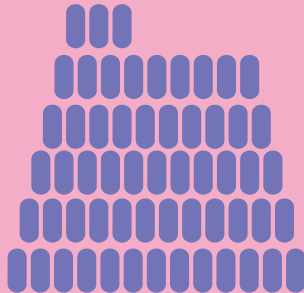

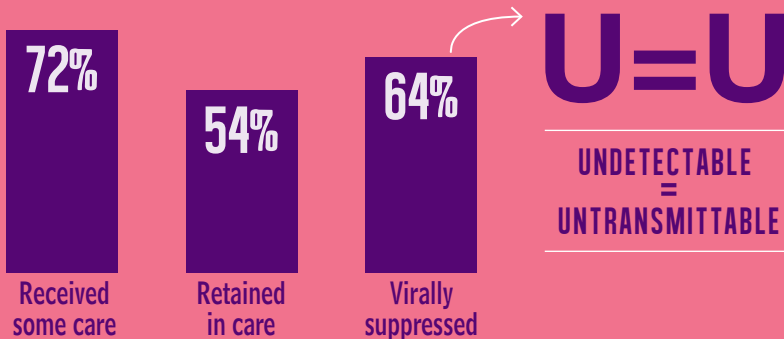

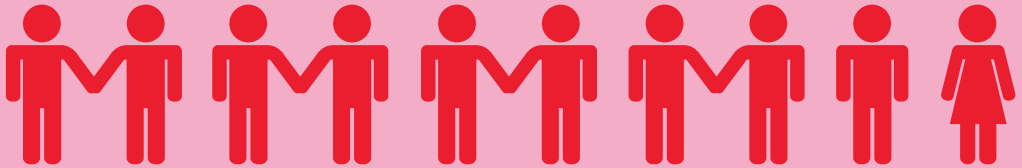


OTHER **7%**

CANNOT TRANSMIT HIV TO SEXUAL PARTNERS (2021)

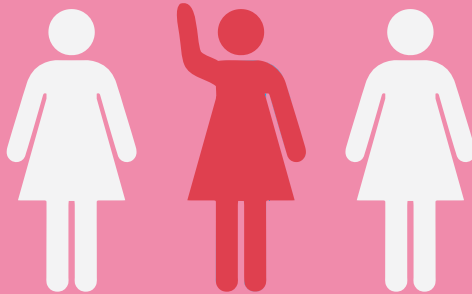


LATINO MEN ACCOUNT FOR **9** OUT OF **10**
NEW HIV CASES AMONG LATINOS IN 2019

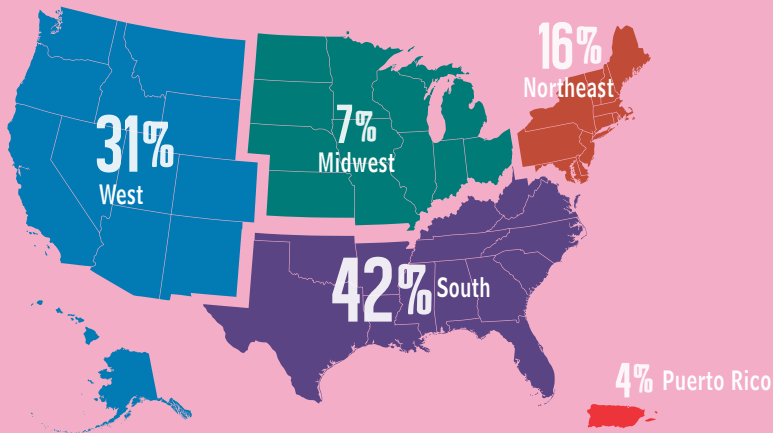


OUT OF THESE 9, **8** WERE AMONG LATINO MSM
