


IN 2023, **13,410 LATINOS** WERE NEWLY

37 PER DAY




IN 2023, LATINOS REPRESENTED **19%** OF THE

- BUT ACCOUNTED FOR -






IN 2022, **16% OF LATINOS**






UNEQUAL ACCESS TO PrEP, A MEDICATION TO PREVENT HIV, PUTS **LATINOS** AT HIGH RISK (2024)



ONLY **64%** OF LATINOS LIVING WITH HIV
HAVE ACHIEVED AN UNDETECTABLE VIRAL LOAD; THEREFORE
CANNOT TRANSMIT HIV TO SEXUAL PARTNERS (2022)




LATINO MEN ACCOUNT FOR **8 OUT OF 9**
NEW HIV CASES AMONG LATINOS IN 2022




OUT OF THESE 8, 7 WERE AMONG LATINO MSM
