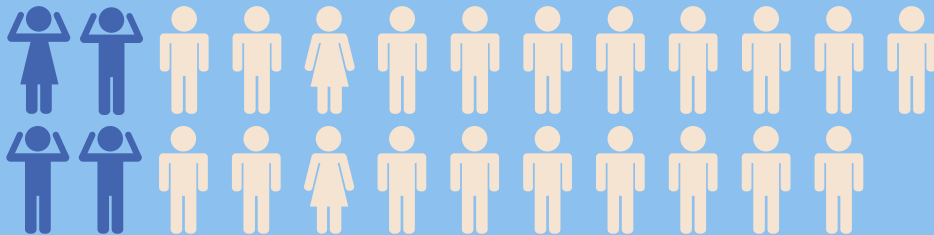

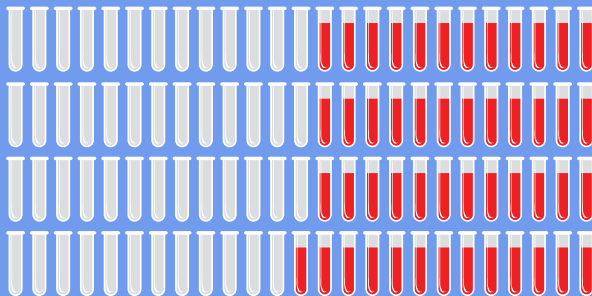
IN 2022, **16% OF LATINOS**

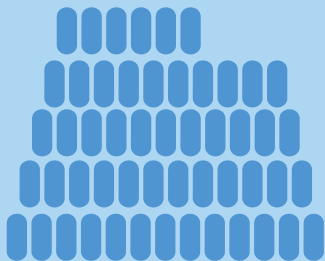

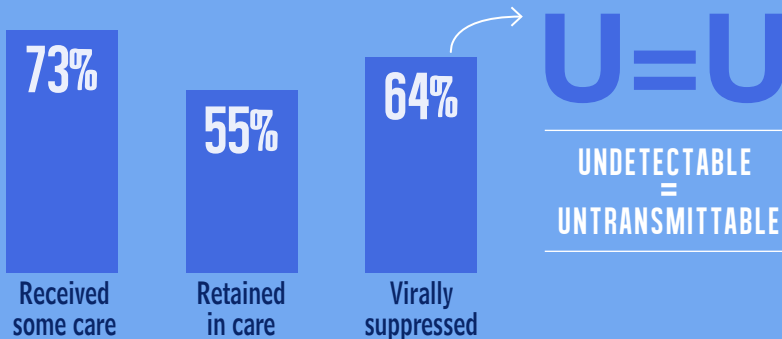

CANNOT TRANSMIT HIV TO SEXUAL PARTNERS (2022)**

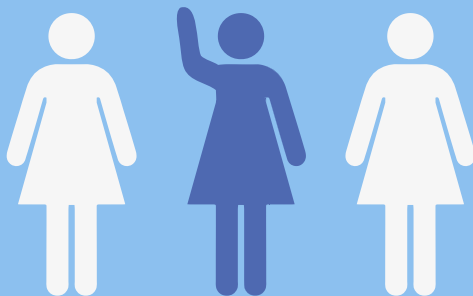


LATINO MEN ACCOUNT FOR **8** OUT OF **9**  
NEW HIV CASES AMONG LATINOS IN 2022



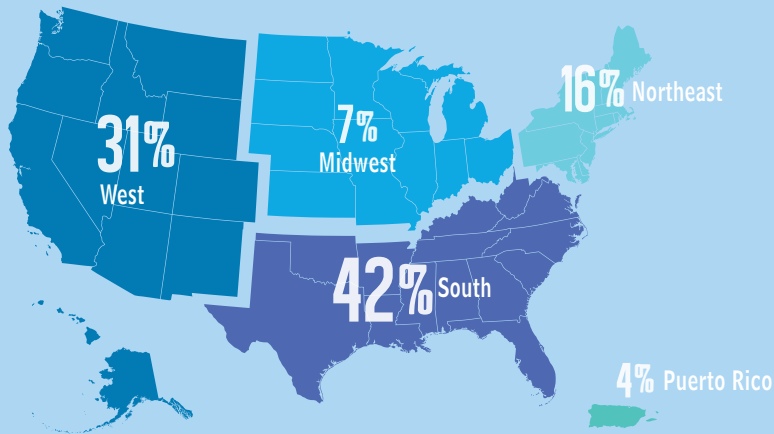
